**WHEREAS** Policing is one of many important ingredients in ensure peace, order and good governance of our communities to ensure that they are safe places for families to grow and flourish;

**WHEREAS** there is a need and a commitment under the Treaty and Agreements relating to policing for periodic reviews, audits and assessments to ensure that standards and policing services are maintained at the high level possible;

**WHEREAS** the maintenance and delivery of consistent policing services in 2022 is proving very challenging throughout the province of Quebec, Canada and in particular for Eeyou Istchee;

**SUBJECT:** Immediate Implementation Of The Wildlife Directives In The Areas Of Special Interest For The Cree

**WHEREAS** one of the first objectives of the Adapted Forestry regime is to take into consideration the Cree way of life as stipulated in section 3.1 of Chapter 3 Forestry -Agreement concerning a new relationship between le Gouvernement du Québec and the Cree of Québec;

WHEREAS specific management standards are to be applied to maintain or improve the habitat of very important wildlife species (moose, marten, beaver, hare, fish, caribou and partridge) in the areas of special interest for the Cree as agreed in Chapter 3—Forestry amendment no.6 JBNQA 3.10 Areas of special interest to the Cree;

**WHEREAS** these areas of special interest for the Cree were clearly identified in 2002 by the tallyman in all the traplines within the Chapter 3—Forestry application;

**WHEREAS** those areas of special interest are to benefit from specific protection to improve the level of harmonization between forest development activities and traditional activities including hunting, fishing and trapping as agreed in chapter 3—Forestry amendment No. 6 JBNQA 3.10 Areas of special interest to the Cree;

**WHEREAS** wildlife directives guiding the elaboration of development strategies that will take into account the protection and development of wildlife habitats remain to be implemented as agreed in chapter 3—Forestry article 59 of Schedule C-4 Agreement concerning a new relationship between le Gouvernement du Québec and the Crees of Québec and amendment No. 6 JBNQA Schedule C-3;

**WHEREAS** a wildlife draft directive on the protection and development of wildlife habitats was submitted to the Quebec government on March 29, 2005, for approval and was never implemented;



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**WHEREAS** a wildlife directive joint committee was set in place in 2019 (following amendment No. 6) to elaborate again a new set of wildlife management directives. The Cree members of the joint committee have submitted interim measures to be implemented without delay in order to maintain and protect the wildlife habitat in the areas of special interest for the Cree;

**WHEREAS** interviews and numerous testimonies from the tallymen reveal that the extent of forestry activities (harvesting and road building) in the areas of special interest for the Cree (25%) is excessive. There remains a strong sentiment that the ecological integrity of these forest areas is not being preserved and that very important wildlife habitat for the Crees are being jeopardized;

### IT IS RESOLVED THAT

**THAT** the delegates of the Grand Council of the Crees (Eeyou Istchee)/Cree Nation Government 48<sup>th</sup>/45<sup>th</sup> Annual General Assembly request that every effort be made to implement interim measures to maintain and improve moose habitat, including the moose habitat directives related to the protection of Winter habitats (moose yards), Protection of summer habitat, protection of unique habitats, riparian travels and access corridor, wildlife habitat and silvicultural treatments and seasonal schedule of harvesting operations, until such time as permanent wildlife directives have been established;



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**THAT** the delegates of the Grand Council of the Crees (Eeyou Istchee)/Cree Nation Government 48<sup>th</sup>/45<sup>th</sup> Annual General Assembly further request that the directives on the protection and development of Wildlife habitats on the territory foreseen under the Agreement concerning a new relationship between le Gouvernement du Québec and the Crees of Québec be finalized as soon as possible, subject to the appropriate consultations of communities and land users;

**THAT** the Cree Nation Government is hereby mandated to do all things necessary to give effect to the foregoing and provide the appropriate reporting.

SUBJECT: Whapmagoostui Access to Government Fuel Subsidy

**WHEREAS** the Gasoline Program through the Kativik Regional Government delivers meaningful support to subsistence harvesters by facilitating their access to hunting and fishing areas;

**WHEREAS** the harvesting activities are of crucial importance for Cree to continue practicing their way of life and generates an important source of food and contributes to preservation of our cultural identity. Traditional food is moreover recognized for its high nutritional value;

**WHEREAS** the high price of gasoline in the region is due, in part, to additional costs incurred for the transportation of fuel from the south to the community Whapmagoostui and, in part, to additional costs incurred for the financing of annual fuel stocks;

**WHEREAS** the annual fuel supply to Whapmagoostui must be carried out during the short summer months when marine shipping lanes are ice-free. Federal and provincial taxes are applied after transportation and financing costs have been added to the price paid for the gasoline by local distributers;

**WHEREAS** the impact on the community members of Whapmagoostui has been increasing substantially each year and this year, the price is the highest ever recorded;

**WHEREAS** a subsidy is available for isolated municipalities in Quebec from the Quebec Government including gas subsidy;

**WHEREAS** a subsidy of 30% of the gas price at the FCNQ co-op will serve to alleviate the fuel cost of continuing the way of life;

**THAT** the delegates of the Grand Council of the Crees (Eeyou Istchee)/Cree Nation Government 48<sup>th</sup>/45<sup>th</sup> Annual General Assembly hereby give fully support for the community of Whapmagoostui to access the same subsidy as their twin community of Kuujjjuaraapik and the rest of the Nunavik communities;
